Wenfeng, a former hedge fund manager, launched DeepSeek as an offshoot of his quantitative hedge fund, High-Flyer, which funds the Al lab. His background in finance and focus on efficient Al development have positioned DeepSeek as a major player in the global Al race. Wenfeng emphasizes the importance of originality and innovation, aiming to shift China's Al industry from imitation to leadership
